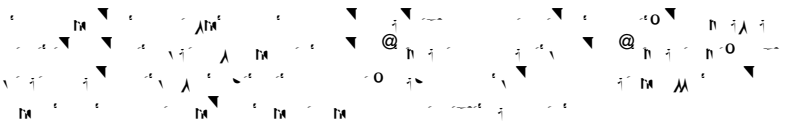
E. Code of Student Conduct

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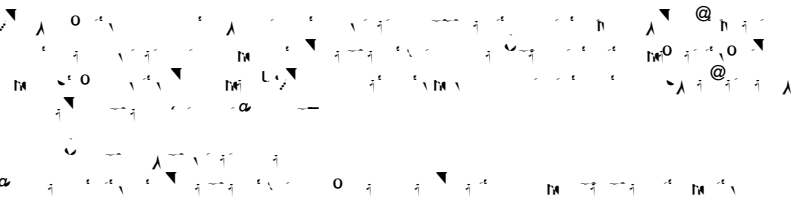

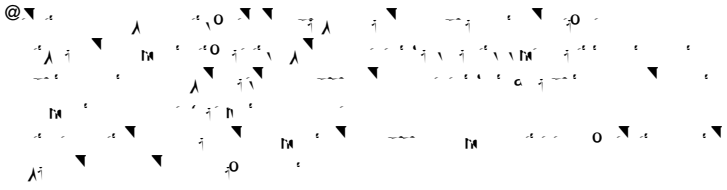


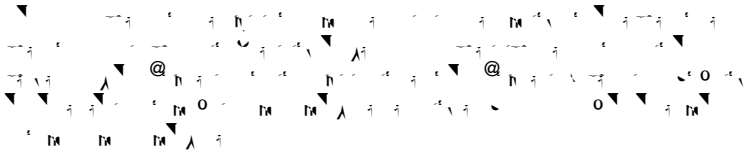

3. Dangerous or Disorderly Conduct

Absence from University

Students are expected to attend all classes and activities. Absence from university is defined as missing a class or activity without a valid excuse. Students who are absent from university for three or more classes or activities in a semester may be subject to disciplinary action. Students who are absent from university for a significant period of time may be required to withdraw from the university.

Access to Student Rooms

Students are allowed access to student rooms during their scheduled class times. Students who are absent from university for a significant period of time may be required to withdraw from the university.

Alcohol-Free Welcome Week

Welcome Week is a time for students to get acquainted with the university and its resources. During this time, students are expected to abstain from alcohol consumption. Students who consume alcohol during Welcome Week may be subject to disciplinary action.

Alcohol Use in Residence

Students are prohibited from consuming alcohol in their residence halls. Students who consume alcohol in their residence halls may be subject to disciplinary action. Students who are found to be consuming alcohol in their residence halls may be required to leave the residence halls and may be subject to suspension from the university.

Balconies

Students are prohibited from using balconies for any purpose. Students who use balconies for any purpose may be subject to disciplinary action.

Bicycles

Students are allowed to use bicycles on campus. Students who use bicycles on campus must follow all applicable rules and regulations.

Damage Deposit

Students who are assigned to a residence hall must pay a damage deposit. The damage deposit is used to cover any damage to the residence hall. Students who do not pay a damage deposit may be subject to disciplinary action.

Damage to Property

Students are prohibited from damaging university property. Students who damage university property may be subject to disciplinary action.

Dangerous Activity

Students are prohibited from engaging in dangerous activity. Students who engage in dangerous activity may be subject to disciplinary action.

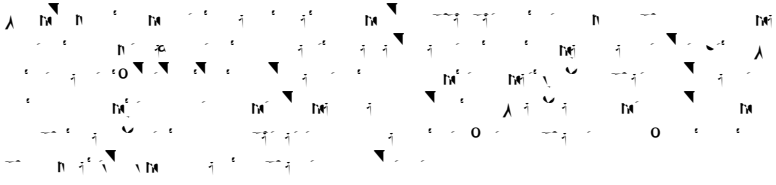

Violence

Violence is defined as the use of force or the threat of force against another person, or the use of force or the threat of force against property.
