

C. Certificate Programs

The University offers Certificate programs in Criminology and Criminal Justice, Social Work, and Geography.

Certificate in Criminology and Criminal Justice

This program is designed for people who have one year of experience in the field of criminal justice. It includes an opportunity to engage in a coordinated, dual degree in Criminology and a part-time law degree.

The program consists of a minimum of 36 credits. Of these, 18 credits are from electives; the remainder are from electives. In choosing electives, students may choose from 15 credits from Grop A and 12 credits from Grop B, or 12 credits from the first year of the second year of the program. Courses offered include: Criminology and Criminal Justice, Native Studies, Philosophy and Sociology. Enrollment in most courses will be limited.

Certificate in Geology
