

School of Education

The S.Thoma BEd is a 3-year baccalaureate degree program that builds the student's understanding of education, science, communication, and the liberal arts.

In the undergraduate curriculum, the student will receive a liberal arts education, and the BEd program. In addition, the student will receive a thorough background in the liberal arts and the sciences.

The BEd program is designed to provide the student with a field-based education, all of which is effective in the classroom and the educational setting.

The S.Thoma BEd is an intensive 60 credit-hour program leading to the calendar year. It offers the student a concentration in the field of teaching a core element (K-5), middle and secondary (6-12), and secondary language (Foreign).

The program is designed to encourage the student to achieve each. One common element is the use of technology in teaching and learning. Faculty have a close relationship with BEd classmates, as well as in the field placement and taking an active role in the student's field-based education. A member of the BEd class, the student will learn to be a high level of effectiveness in the BEd field. Because of the intensive nature of the curriculum, the student will find that the program's demand, time, energy, and ability to learn the kind of knowledge required for the field.

A. Admission to Education

Admission to the program is limited. A major factor in the selection process is the minimum academic achievement. A strong academic record is a necessary condition for acceptance. Evidence of field-based ability, as well as a letter of reference, is a condition of admission. The student must have a minimum grade point average of 2.7 in the liberal arts and the sciences. Application Procedures

You are eligible to be a Bachelor of Education Program student in the Admissions Office. Important details:

1. a complete application form to the University;
2. a complete letter from a B.Ed. application form;
3. a non-refundable application fee of \$55 (\$40 for New Brunswick Applicants);
4. a letter (800-1000 words) in which you discuss in detail your experience in becoming a teacher, your teaching experience (elementary, middle/secondary/tertiary level), your educational background, the program, an informal/informal teaching experience you may have had, your knowledge, and an acknowledgment of the importance of field placement;
5. your experience letter should be a useful teaching experience in elementary/secondary and ability to teach (teaching experience (experience, work, can teach, discipline, ability to teach, knowledge, and experience). Your experience letter should be a useful letter in the application. Please refer to the Referees for the Bachelor of Education Applicants form. Referees should be notified of the application and sign the application. Referees should be notified of the application.
6. Official transcript of marks for all secondary education in your province. If you are a non-resident in the province, you should have an official transcript of marks from the Admissions Office by January 15, and have a recommendation made by the final transcript of marks for a degree program.
7. a written statement in which you indicate your knowledge and understanding of the program.

Note: Application fee, application form, and application letter should be submitted to the Admissions Office by January 15, 2015.

Notification of Admission

Candidates for admission to the B.Ed. program will be notified of their admission status in the letter of the election process. After receiving an offer of admission, accepted candidates are required to submit a non-refundable \$300 advance deposit to the university in their application.
