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SOCI-2123. Introduction to Sociology of Globalization

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2023-2024 Catalog Course Descriptions

SOCI-2443. Racialization and Ethnicity (PEAC)

This course examines the social construction of race and ethnicity, and the ways in which these categories are used to categorize and distinguish people. It explores the historical and contemporary processes of racialization and ethnicization, and the social and cultural consequences of these processes. Topics include the role of race and ethnicity in social inequality, migration, and identity formation.

SOCI-2513. Sociology of Communication

This course explores the relationship between communication and society. It examines the ways in which communication shapes social identity, culture, and social structure. Topics include the role of mass media, social media, and communication technology in contemporary society. The course also explores the ways in which communication is used to create and maintain social norms and values.

SOCI-2523. Sociology of Aging (WSGS) (GERO 2113)
