The specific requirements for Honors in a particular discipline are described in section 4. Individual departments, in addition to approval, also have specific requirements for college applied and Honors.

The general college requirements for Honors are the same as those for a general BA. (See Section 4: Programs, Part A.3. General College Requirements.)

Candidates in the Honors program are normally expected to maintain a grade point average of 3.0 in the Honors program. In calculating the grade point average for Honors, all courses in the Honors program (in interdisciplinary programs) will be counted. For Honors graduation, a minimum grade point average of 3.0 in the Honors program (in interdisciplinary programs) is required. Dickinson is a designated Honors graduate school and has earned a combined average of 3.7 over the last 10 academic years (60 credits) of the program.

Admission to Honors is handled informally by the Chair of the Department and the Registrar.

Students pursuing an Honors BA degree must complete a Minimum requirement of 18 credits in one program. The specific requirements for a Minimum in a particular program are described in section 4. Students who wish to designate a Minimum are responsible for notifying the Registrar of their election.

The college of Arts and Sciences is normally a designated recipient of a S. Thomas Bachelor of Applied Arts degree and a diploma from the Community College.

Bachelor of Applied Arts, General Design, and Research

To graduate with a Bachelor of Applied Arts in Geology, the student must complete the college, in addition to the requirements of the S. Thomas University one-year Honors

man Service Diploma at the Nebraska Business and Community College (NBCC). Upon successful completion of the NBCC Human Service Diploma program, including placement in the field of Geology, students will be awarded 30 credit hours toward a Bachelor of Applied Arts in Geology. The eligible students at St. Thomas University will continue the following program of study:

Students will take 30 credit hours. The electives shall be taken from Geology A, electives from Geology B, and 6 credit hours from either Geology A, Geology B, or electives.

Students will take 30 credit hours. The core will include Geology 1013 and 1023 (prior to March 2013, in 2013 and 2023), 6 credit hours in selected core courses in Geology, 3 credit hours in Geology electives, and 15 credit hours in other electives. See course selection for the Geology Major in Section Four of the University Calendar.

Students will take 30 credit hours. The core will include 21 credit hours in
