ECON-3333. Perspectives on Underdevelopment

ECON-3343. Banking and International Finance

Prerequisite: ECON-3343. Banking and International Finance. This course covers the theory and practice of banking and international finance. Topics include: the role of banks, the money market, the foreign exchange market, and the balance of payments.

ECON-3433. Economics of Government

This course examines the economic behavior of government and the impact of government policy on the economy. Topics include: public goods, externalities, and the theory of public choice.

ECON-3443. New Brunswick Economy

This course provides an overview of the New Brunswick economy. Topics include: the structure of the economy, the role of government, and the impact of globalization.

ECON-3453. Labour Economics

This course examines the labor market and the role of government. Topics include: the theory of labor supply and demand, the impact of minimum wage, and the role of unions.

ECON-4013. Mathematical Economics I

This course introduces the mathematical tools used in economics. Topics include: calculus, linear algebra, and differential equations. Prerequisite: ECON-1023, 2103, 2113.

ECON-4113. Mathematical Economics II

This course continues the study of mathematical economics. Topics include: optimization, dynamic programming, and game theory. Prerequisite: ECON-4103.

ECON-4183. Econometrics I

This course introduces the theory and practice of econometrics. Topics include: the theory of estimation, hypothesis testing, and regression analysis. Prerequisite: ECON-3133.

ECON-4193. Econometrics II

This course continues the study of econometrics. Topics include: advanced estimation techniques, time series analysis, and panel data analysis. Prerequisite: ECON-4103-1023 and 4133.

ECON-4506. Work Study Project

This course provides students with a practical experience in the field of economics. Students will work on a project related to their field of study. Prerequisite: ECON-4103.
