

ITAL-3043. Italian Cinema

This course explores the history and evolution of Italian cinema from the silent era to the present day. Students will analyze the works of major directors such as Fellini, Pasolini, and Antonioni, and discuss the social and cultural context of Italian film. The course includes screenings of key films and a final research paper.

Latin**LATI-1013. Introduction to Latin I**

This course introduces students to the basics of Latin grammar and vocabulary. The focus is on understanding the structure of Latin sentences and the use of the main verb forms. Students will also learn to read and translate short passages of Latin prose.

LATI-1023. Introduction to Latin II

This course continues the study of Latin grammar and vocabulary, focusing on more complex sentence structures and the use of the subjunctive mood. Students will also learn to read and translate longer passages of Latin prose.

LATI-2103. Latin III (Intermediate)

This course provides a more in-depth study of Latin grammar and vocabulary, focusing on the use of the infinitive and the gerund. Students will also learn to read and translate more advanced passages of Latin prose.

LATI-3103. Latin IV (Intermediate)

This course provides a final review of Latin grammar and vocabulary, focusing on the use of the participle and the supine. Students will also learn to read and translate more advanced passages of Latin prose.

Romance Languages**ROML-2013. Introduction to Linguistics I**

This course introduces students to the basic concepts and methods of linguistics. The focus is on understanding the structure of language and the relationship between language and society. Students will also learn to apply linguistic theory to the analysis of real-world language data.

ROML-2023. Introduction to Linguistics II

This course continues the study of linguistics, focusing on the relationship between language and culture. Students will also learn to apply linguistic theory to the analysis of real-world language data.
