

- Varsity and club athletes are expected to treat everyone with courtesy and respect
- Varsity and club athletes must abide by the rules and regulations of their sport, as set out by the regional and/or national sport-governing body. Varsity and club athletes, in accordance with the Canadian Code of Ethics for Sport, are expected to avoid any negative interaction or conflict with other athletes, officials, and spectators.
- Varsity and club athletes are expected to avoid the use of anabolic steroids or other illegal substances. Varsity and club athletes who engage in or support the use of illegal substances will be subject to disciplinary action. Varsity and club athletes are expected to follow the guidelines established by the Centre for Ethics in Sport. Varsity and club athletes who engage in or support the use of illegal substances will be subject to disciplinary action.
- Varsity and club athletes are expected to avoid any negative interaction or conflict with other athletes, officials, and spectators.
- Varsity and club athletes are expected to avoid the illegal use of "recreational" drugs and alcohol. Varsity and club athletes are expected to refrain from providing recreational drugs and alcohol to others. Varsity and club athletes are expected to follow the guidelines established by the Centre for Ethics in Sport. Varsity and club athletes who engage in or support the use of illegal substances will be subject to disciplinary action.
- Varsity and club athletes are expected to exhibit conduct at all times which complements the形象 of the University.
- Varsity and club athletes are expected to recognize and to pursue academic success in accordance with the Canadian Code of Ethics for Sport.
